LETTER FROM THE BY5 LEADERS

Dear Friends.

Covid-19 has exposed significant cracks that threaten the very underpinnings of our country's socioeconomic structure. Not least among these cracks are those associated with dependable childcare and high-quality pre-k programming. Early childhood education has been particularly and adversely impacted by the unprecedented challenges of the last two years.

Early childhood professionals have long been woefully underpaid: Wages for these essential workers are often barely above the poverty level. Consequently,

when the government began to financially assist those who

were out of work because of closure from the pandemic, many early childhood educators made the rational decision to accept these benefits and remain at

home. This created a significant gap in the early childhood workforce that is still bedeviling us,

which has led to fewer available spots for children to be enrolled in these critical programs. BY5 is actively collaborating with our partners to address this shortfall of skilled personnel.

Over the past two years providers have expressed to BY5 feelings of isolation and a desire to collaborate with peers. In an effort to address this concern, BY5 began hosting monthly provider calls via Zoom where any provider could share and hear challenges, help each other solve problems, or just lend an ear. Additionally, using grant funding, we hired an Assistant Director of Childcare Resources, BriAnna Green. Her focus is on maintaining contact with our providers and assisting them in any way that we can, ultimately enhancing the lines of communication with our local providers.

Finally, Muncie BY5 is proud to lead the Birth to 5 Collaborative Action Network (CAN) through the George and Frances Ball Foundation's Cradle to Career Initiative. This network, brings together groups and agencies who work with young children and their families to set meaningful goals to help prepare children for kindergarten. As part of this effort, we are excited to open our Early Childhood Professional Training Center to help further prepare those working in the field to achieve job satisfaction while helping children grow to love learning. Much of the preparation for this training center was completed and funded in 2021. We look forward to sharing the exciting results with you in next year's annual report.

Providing Support to Our Providers

It's no secret that childcare centers have historically operated on lean budgets.

This delicate balance—the cost of providing quality care while

maintaining an affordable rate for families—only got more difficult when the pandemic hit. Childcare providers were confronted with additional costs for cleaning and safety supplies, and the industry took a hit from the national employment shortage.

BY5 is proud to provide much-needed provider support through Early Learning Indiana's Stronger Together grant program. As a Stronger Together grantee, BY5 acts as a shared service hub for our community's five largest providers (that together serve a significant percentage of our community's children in childcare).

After convening with these five providers to assess their needs and determine how we could best help them, we identified three key areas on which to focus our support:

- 1. BUSINESS AND FINANCIAL TRAINING We've enlisted a business analyst from Indiana Small Business Development Center to host a monthly "Know Your Numbers" series to help our providers understand their finances. This early childhood business-specific training will continue through 2022 and 2023.
- 2. MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORT We hired a social work intern to visit each provider and conduct basic mental health checks of both staff and children in several childcare settings. A licensed child psychologist will then create a curriculum for early childhood professionals to use in the classroom as well as offer suggestions for self-care for the staff. BY5 will support these plans, with our hope being that this will reduce employee turnover, thus saving the providers money.
- 3. CURRICULUM AND ASSESSMENT SUPPORT Creative Curriculum and intense training were offered to 25 preschool teachers and directors to enhance their teaching practices related to standards-based instruction to improve kindergarten readiness.

Remaining funds will be used in 2022 and 2023 for our early childhood professional training center.

Growing Team, Growing Impact

In 2021, we welcomed Sarah Fiechter, Strategic Initiatives Coordinator, to our team. Sarah leads the efforts pertaining to our strategic goals and community programs. We also added Bri Green, Assistant Director of Childcare Resources, to lead connections with our

SARAH FIECHTER providers, including everything from linking them to the correct state agency or helping to deliver food at Second Harvest Food Bank for their struggling families. Together, Sarah and Bri have already made a real impact on our organization and our community's early childcare network.



Mini-Grants Support COVID Needs of Lower-Level Providers

Via funding from Ball Brothers Foundation and George and Frances Ball Foundation, BY5 offered three rounds of "mini-grants" to Paths to Quality Level 0-2 childcare providers to support the purchase of equipment, supplies, and more. Childcare centers at these levels often do not have the same funding opportunities from the state or private funders as their "higher quality" counterparts. BY5 sought to level the playing field by ensuring these childcare centers also had access to the resources they needed to meet new COVID protocols to keep staff, children, and families safe.

Charting a Course for the Future

The following Measurable Outcomes, developed in late 2021, will drive the work of Muncie BY5 for the next several years.

Our community has a strong and aligned EARLY CHILDHOOD PROFESSIONALS PIPELINE.

Investing in Pre-kindergarten

Using On My Way PreK funding, 123 Delaware County children were able to attend preschool at no cost during the 2021-2022 school year. Muncie BY5 provided \$14,657.96 in local match funding for this program. The State of Indiana invested \$278,501.21 for On My Way PreK vouchers while \$396,494.08 was invested in CCDF vouchers with federal funds. In total, \$689,653.25 was invested in high quality early learning for children in Delaware County.


